<p>Tip #1: Take some time to prepare. Do your homework.</p> <p>Look carefully through the University’s website and read about the department and the programme. Also, read any material that you deem necessary. Read around Medical Imaging – in newspaper articles, on the internet, or professional publications. We do not expect you to be an expert (yet!), but we do want to see your enthusiasm. Think about what in particular about Medical Imaging that interests you.</p>	<p>Tip #2: Practice makes perfect.</p> <p>Ask a teacher to give you a mock interview. For extra practice, get a friend, family member or someone you trust to ask you more difficult interview questions.</p>
<p>Tip #3: Plan your journey.</p> <p>Make sure you know where Ho is, how you will get here and how long it will take. Try to arrive at least 30 minutes early, and keep the contact details of the department of medical imaging handy in case you need to get in touch.</p>	<p>Tip #4: Your best self.</p> <p>Be relaxed but stay professional. Think about what you are wearing and what it says about you. For professional courses like medical Imaging, smart attire is expected.</p>
<p>Tip #5: Bring what you need.</p> <p>Do not forget to bring any documents you might need. These include results slips, applications forms, and might also include copies of study leave letters, reference letters, and any other documents you deem necessary to support your application.</p>	<p>Tip #6: Be yourself.</p> <p>We want to know what makes you tick. Tell us why you are passionate about medical imaging and why you want to study at UHAS and in the department of Medical Imaging. Remember, we want to hear from you – so put it in your own words.</p>
<p>Tip #7: Ask questions.</p> <p>Listen carefully to what the interviewer is saying and do not be afraid to ask questions/clarifications. Also, it is a good idea to come prepared with a list of questions to ask about the course, the department and the University.</p>	<p>Tip #8: Be confident and sincere.</p> <p>Be confident. Try and give precise and accurate answers. But if you don’t know, be honest and say so. After all, no one knows everything.</p>

POSSIBLE INTERVIEW QUESTION:

1. Why UHAS?
2. Why Medical Imaging?
3. Currents affairs; For e.g. Who is the Minister of Education? Or Who is the Minister of Health?
4. What's the *main* news item of the day?
5. Questions that assess your ability to think and express yourself; For e.g. Do you think university education should be free? If yes, why? If no, why not?
6. Science-based questions. For e.g. Is blood a cell or a tissue?
7. Ethical questions. For example, consider the case study below;

Your brother secured a scholarship to study in Harvard University in the USA. As a requirement for the scholarship, your brother is to have a medical examination and he must be medically fit, in other words he must not have any serious medical condition otherwise he will lose the scholarship. A clinician requested for a chest x-ray for your brother. You happen to be the radiographer who conducted the chest x-ray. The results of the x-ray indicated that your brother is suffering from TB. Will you change the results to enable your brother secure the scholarship? Explain your answer.
